Notes:

The Reserve Bank of India issued guidelines for appointment of statutory auditors of Commercial Banks (excluding RRBs), UCBs and NBFCs (including HFCs). Banks and UCBs will be required to take prior approval of RBI for appointment/reappointment of SCAs/SAs, on an annual basis. Entities will have to appoint the SCAs/SAs for a continuous period of three years, subject to their satisfying the eligibility norms. This will protect the independence of the auditors.

4. Ashleigh Barty, who won the Porsche Tennis Grand Prix 2021, belongs to which country?



The flagging off ceremony was presided over by Minister of Petroleum & Natural Gas and Steel, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan. Earlier in 2019, petroleum and health ministries had initiated Expressions of Interest for "Procurement of Biodiesel produced from Used Cooking Oil". IOCL has received 51KL of UCO-Biodiesel till March 2021.

TRIFED's new project for Tribal Households

The TRIFED recently signed an agreement with The LINK Fund to work together towards tribal development. TRIFED is Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India

About the Agreement

- Under the agreement, they will work towards tribal employment generation and development. This is to be achieved by providing support to the tribal in increasing value addition to their produce.
- They will also create a women-centres that will promote innovation, infrastructure and entrepreneurship among tribal women.
- Under the agreement TRIFED and LINK will work towards improving the skill training and crafts diversification.

LINK Fund

- LINK Fund is a philanthropic organisation that aims to end extreme poverty and mitigate the effects of Climate Change. It provides funds to meet the basic needs of the poorest population in the world. Their focus is mainly on India, US, Mali, Indonesia, Mali, Nigeria, Nepal, Mauritania and Senegal.
- The fund addresses basic human needs such as education, food and nutrition, large scale infrastructure and women economic empowerment.

Recent developments

- In April 2021, <u>TRIFED launched the SANKLAP SE SIDHI. It is a hundred-day drive</u> to activate the Van Dhan Vikas Kendras.
- In April 2021, TRIFED launched the Tribes India contest.
- In March, 2021, <u>TRIFED announced that the Floriculture mission</u> is to be implemented in twenty-one states.
- It is building <u>TRIFOOD parks</u>. TRIFOOD Parks is a joint initiative between the Ministry of Tribal Affairs and Ministry of Food Processing. These parks procure raw materials from the tribal people, process them and help tribal farmers sell for better prices. TRIFED is providing training to the tribal farmer about processing their produce. This will help to increase their income by bringing better prices for their produce.

India-Russia 2+2 Dialogue

May 1, 2021



The Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the Russian President Vladimir Putin recently agreed to establish "2+2 Ministerial Dialogue". The "2+2 Ministerial" dialogue is held between the defence ministers and foreign ministers.

About 2+2 Dialogue

- India holds similar dialogues with US, Australia and Japan.
- Russia is the first non-QUAD member with which India is to hold the dialogue.
- In 2021, President Vladimir Putin is to visit India to hold the India-Russia bilateral summit. The summit is alternatively held in India and Russia.

India-Russia

- Currently, Russia is the largest Defence Supplier of India. Also, the key defence systems of India such as S-400 are bought from Russia.
- Both the countries are members of Shanghai Cooperation Organisation, BRICS.
- Russia supports India for its permanent membership at the United Nations Security Council.
- The countries had earlier set a trade target of reaching 30 billion USD of trade by 2025. The dialogue will help them achieve the target. Previously, the countries agreed to establish the International North-South Transport Corridor, cooperation at the Eurasian Economic Union and Chennai-Vladivostok Maritime Corridor.
- The Astronauts shortlisted for the Human Space Flight Programme of India were trained by Russia.
- The Nuclear Power Plant that is being built in Kudankulam in Tamil Nadu is built with Russian Cooperation.
- India recently approved Russia's Sputnik V. It is the third vaccine to be approved in the country after COVAXIN and COVISHIELD.

What agreements govern India-Russia relations?

In 1971, India and Russia signed the Treaty of Peace and Friendship. This agreement was the manifestation of shared goals between the countries. After the dissolution of Soviet Union in 1991, India and Russia signed the Military-Technical Cooperation Agreement.

World No Tobacco Day

May 31, 2021



World No Tobacco Day is being observed on May 31, 2021 under the theme "Commit to Quit". It is observed since 1987 after member states of World Health Organisation created "World No Tobacco Day" to bring global attention towards tobacco epidemic and associated preventable death.

Why this day is significant?

- As per lancet study, in some three decades, about 200 million deaths were caused by smoking tobacco use while the annual economic costs because of smoking tobacco use is more than US \$1 trillion.
- Further, one in six non-communicable disease-related deaths is due to smoking tobacco.
- Lancet has identified Tobacco control as a crucial and necessary" part to reach WHO's global goals of 25 percent reduction in "premature mortality" from non-communicable diseases by 2025 to comply with UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

• Thus, this day becomes important to raise awareness among people of harmful effects of smoking Tobacco.

Top Smoking countries

10 countries with largest number of tobacco smokers as of 2019 are- China, India, Indonesia, USA, Russia, Bangladesh, Japan, Turkey, Vietnam, and Philippines.

What are the concerns?

According to World Health Organization (WHO), nearly 70 percent of 1.3 billion tobacco users across the world lack access to tools required for quitting Tobacco. This access gap has further exacerbated in 2020 because health workforce are being mobilized to handle covid-19 pandemic'.

Goa launches solar-based electrification programme

May 31, 2021



Chief Minister of Goa, Pramod Sawant, launched solar-based electrification programme for rural households of state, on the occasion of Goa statehood Day (May 30).

About Solar-Based Electrification Programme

This programme will bring electricity using renewable energy to rural areas in Goa where grid connectivity is not feasible. It was launched with focus on delivering clean, reliable and affordable energy to all. Solar PV-based home lighting systems was inaugurated two days

after agreement was signed between Convergence Energy Services Ltd (CESL) and Goa Energy Development Agency (GEDA).

How this project is different?

Electrification project is first off-grid electricity engagement by CESL which will install and maintain the solar PV systems for five years under Remote Village Electrification (RVE) programme. CESL will undertake programme across villages and hamlets in coordination with Gram panchayats.

About CESL

CESL is a 100 percent owned subsidiary of EESL. It is a new energy company which focuses on delivering clean, affordable, and reliable energy. It focuses on energy solutions which can be generated with the confluence of renewable energy, electric mobility, and climate change.

Energy Efficiency Services Limited (EESL)

EESL, world's largest public energy service company (ESCO), is owned 100 percent by of Government of India. It is a joint venture of state-owned NTPC Limited, Power Finance Corporation and POWERGRID. It was established under Ministry of Power to facilitate energy efficiency projects.
